2019 Waterworks Construction Projects

The Seaview/Longview main replacement project is going ahead for 2019. The project went out for public tender, (posted on BC Bid) on February 13, 2019 and tender closed on March 7, 2019. This project is part of the DBID Waterworks Capital Replacement Plan and is funded through Parcel Taxes. The tender has been awarded to Wacor Holdings Ltd. Wacor will begin mobilizing the week of April 8 and breaking ground the week of April 15. Substantial completion of work is expected by June 14.

Water service interruptions expected: In addition to the main replacement, this project also includes installation of a new hydrant on Thompson Clarke Dr. West and replacement of two existing hydrants at Faye Road & Jamieson Road. It is expected that during various tie-ins to the existing system that water service will be interrupted.

Depending on where the tie-in is located; service could be interrupted to a significant portion of the water system.

In the event of a disruption, affected homeowners will be given as much notice as possible. For small, localized interruptions, notices will be hand delivered. Notice for widespread interruptions will be provided through the **emergency contact email list**, postings on the website and postings at the office. **If you have not provided the office with an email address for emergency contact, please do so to ensure you receive notifications.**

Please obey construction signage in the affected areas. We apologize for any road and service disruptions this project may cause.

Fire Hall Replacement Project

Work is progressing on the fire hall plans. Magnum Project Management has been brought on to establish a working budget. The budget will be based on a complete set of working drawings that are being developed by Carsten Jensen Architect. Structural, electrical and mechanical engineers have been contracted to assist in the development of the working drawings package. The budget is expected to be completed in April at which time the board will be able to move forward developing a borrowing plan. A full information package will be sent out to all home owners in the district with details regarding the project and the required referendum for borrowing funds.

Fire Department News

Open Burning Reminder: Permits are required for the burning of **dry yard waste** effective **April 15th** and conditions apply. You must check the **venting index** prior to commencing your burn. Venting index must be "good" for the period you will be burning. Venting index information available at: <http://www.env.gov.bc.ca/epd/epdpa/venting/venting.html> or call 1-888-281-2992.

Be considerate of your neighbours when burning so you don't impact their daily routine or health. Burn materials hot, infrequently and **ONLY** when venting permits so the smoke goes straight up.
