**Reservoir Update** – the external and internal inspections were completed in February 2024. With a few minor exterior repairs engineers estimate another decade of serviceable life.

**TCW Update** – contacted engineering firms are developing cost estimates to relocate the water main currently under threat from a failing steep slope. RDN Parks Dept was recently onsite and is very interested in realigning their now closed ravine path to the new route of the relocated water main that would link Ocean Trail to TCW and to Faye Rd. via an existing road allowance.

- Quarterly Water Tolls fund the operating budget for Waterworks.
- ♦ New rates in effect:
- Base rate: \$64.35/quarter (no water allowance)
- ♦ Consumption tiers are as follows:
- ♦ 1-50 cubic meters: \$.58/m3
- 51-100 cubic meters: \$.72/m3
- >100 cubic meters: \$1.19/m3

Reminder: Annual Parcel and Fire Protection Tax Due on May 15th – invoices are included with this mailout.

#### How do you compare?

Some water consumption numbers for this invoice period:

8% of all households used no water

73% of all households used less than 40 m3

13% of all households used between 40 and 74 m3

2% of all households used between 75 and 100 m3

4% of all households used over 100 m3
